

Today we are reading and writing words with a split digraphs (as in 'hope')

A split digraph is a digraph that is split by a consonant. It makes a long vowel sound, e.g. 'o-e' (hope), It says the letter name and not the sound eg says 'O' in these words.

It makes the same sound as **oa** and **oe**

Ask your child to say **oa oe** quietly, loudly and in a robot voice.

Ask your child to name each picture below and then use their robot arms to segment to spell them e.g. They would say "h-O-m" and then write the word 'home'.



Ask your child to say each sound and blend them together to read these words:

throne **globe** **smoke**

Choose one of the sentences below to say to your child out loud. Help them to use their phonics skills and knowledge of tricky words to write it.

The dog had a bone. or

She had a bump and broke her nose.
